Work Group News

Blinding Identity Taxonomy from Dativa/Hyperledger Indy using Consent Receipt

Reminder to all renewing members to <u>get your dues</u> <u>in on time</u>! Blinding Identity Taxonomy (BIT) is a joint effort with Hyperledger Indy and the outstanding efforts of Paul Knowles and the team at Dativa. Recently, BIT was in the news again as Dativa's submission to the UK Parliament was taken up and published. While this initiative addresses some of the fundamental demands of the EU's new GDPR regulation on the storage of data, we believe the BIT initiative is relevant to all companies and not merely those which store data about EU citizens.

Furthermore, <u>Jan Lindquist</u> from Dativa has created a groundbreaking Hyperledger Indy system that includes data sharing receipts using identified or anonymous proofs of consent. This approach is a very interesting contrast to the typical ways of perceiving the role of 'proof' in decentralized systems. Jan will be presenting the work on an upcoming <u>Consent and Information Sharing Work Group</u> call so you are strongly encouraged to join it now.

The Leadership Council has approved one of the two alternative proposed draft Charters of the continuation of the work from the Identity Ecosystem Steering Group whose assets were transitioned to <u>Kantara's Educational</u> <u>Foundation</u> in June 2018. <u>The Federated Identity Resilient</u> <u>Ecosystem (FIRE) Working Group</u> is carrying forward and building on the work of IDESG, which received \$7 million funding from NIST and had hundreds of people participating in the effort to build the IDEF Registry. The IDEF Registry includes the supporting framework, the Trustmark creation and rating method for a self-assessment system. In the coming weeks, be on the lookout for the template Wiki from the approved Charter which is being developed by Staff.
