INFORMATION EXCHANGES BUILT ON NIEM

- International Justice and Public Safety Network (Nlets) - exchange mission-critical law enforcement information.
- Amber Alert - child abduction emergency alert.
- Prescription Drug Monitoring Exchange (PMIX) - Mitigate pharmaceutical drug abuse across state lines.
- FBI Incident Reporting National Data Exchange System (N-Dex) and NIBRS, standardized and secure criminal justice information sharing to relevant criminal justice agencies.
- FBI National Crime Information Center (NCIC) - United States' central database for tracking crime-related information.
- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Emergency Preparedness and Response Exchange Requirements - exchange and sharing of critical emergency management (EM) data.
- National Electronic Interstate Compact Enterprise (NEICE) - placement of children in foster care across state lines.
- Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) e-Notice.

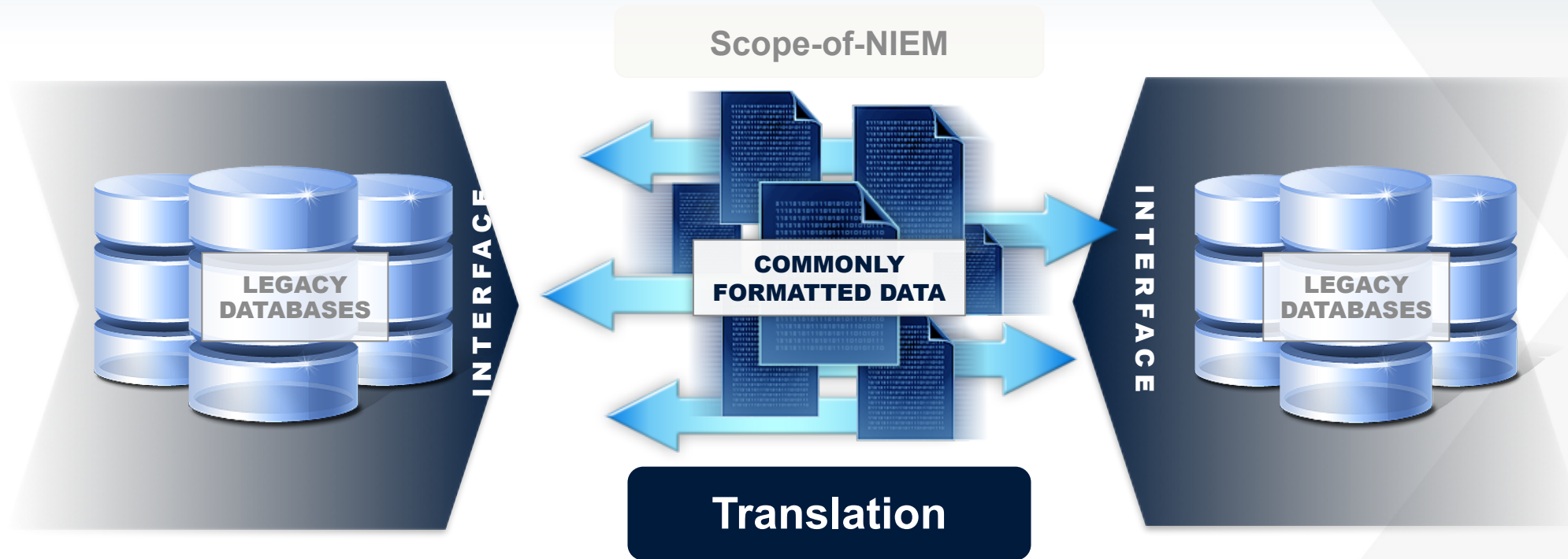

EXCHANGING DATA IN MOTION

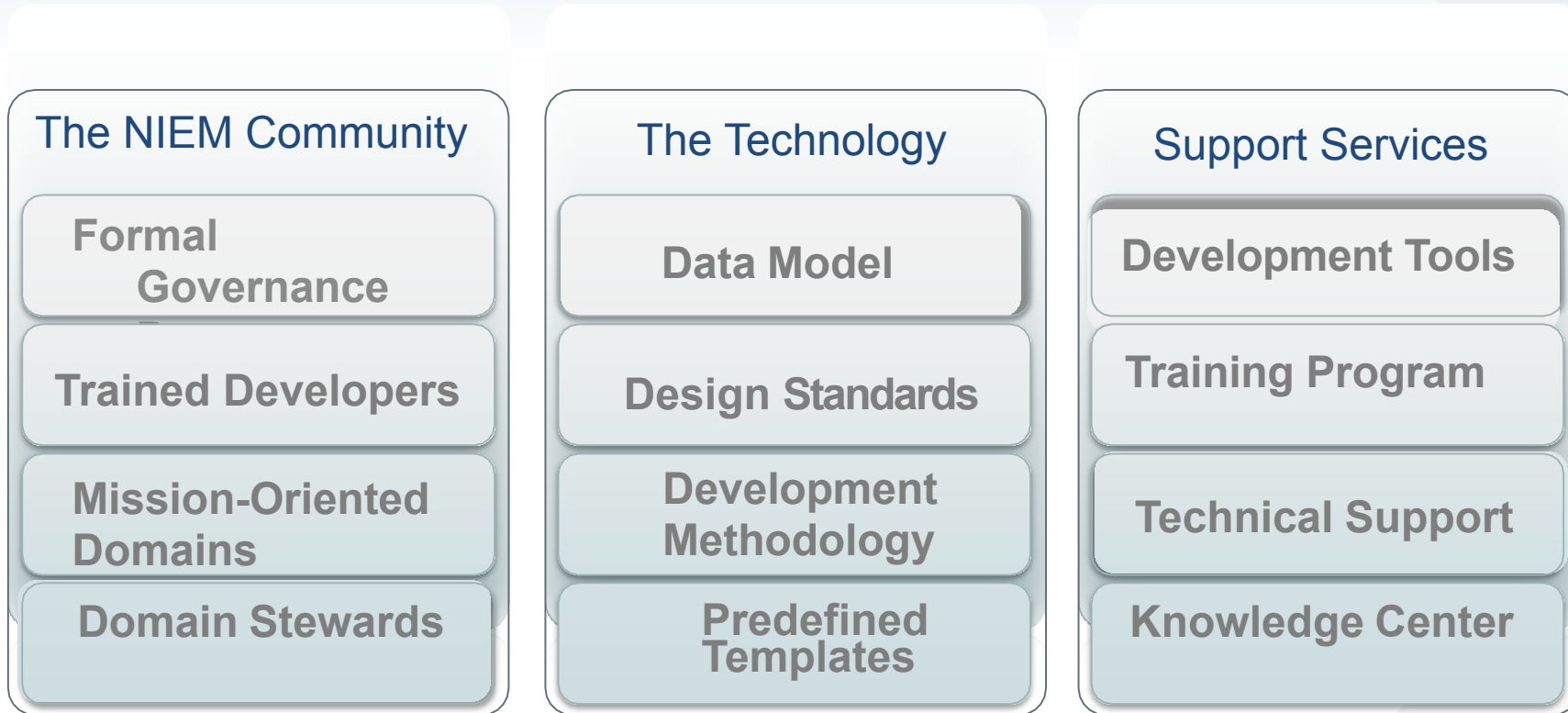


NIEM intentionally does not address standardizing data inside legacy systems. NIEM serves as a translation layer (providing a common understanding) between and across disparate systems.

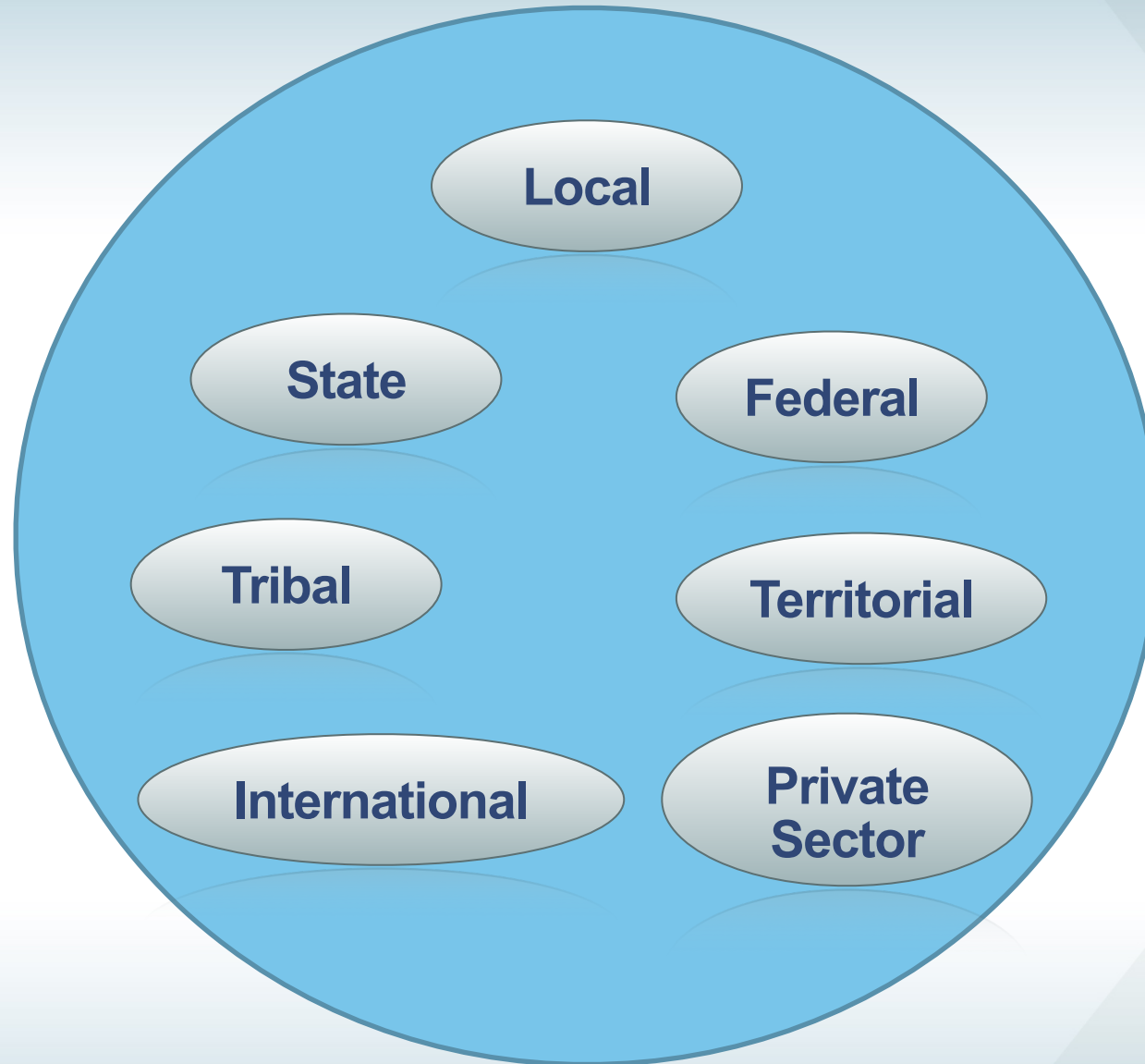
NIEM CONTRIBUTION

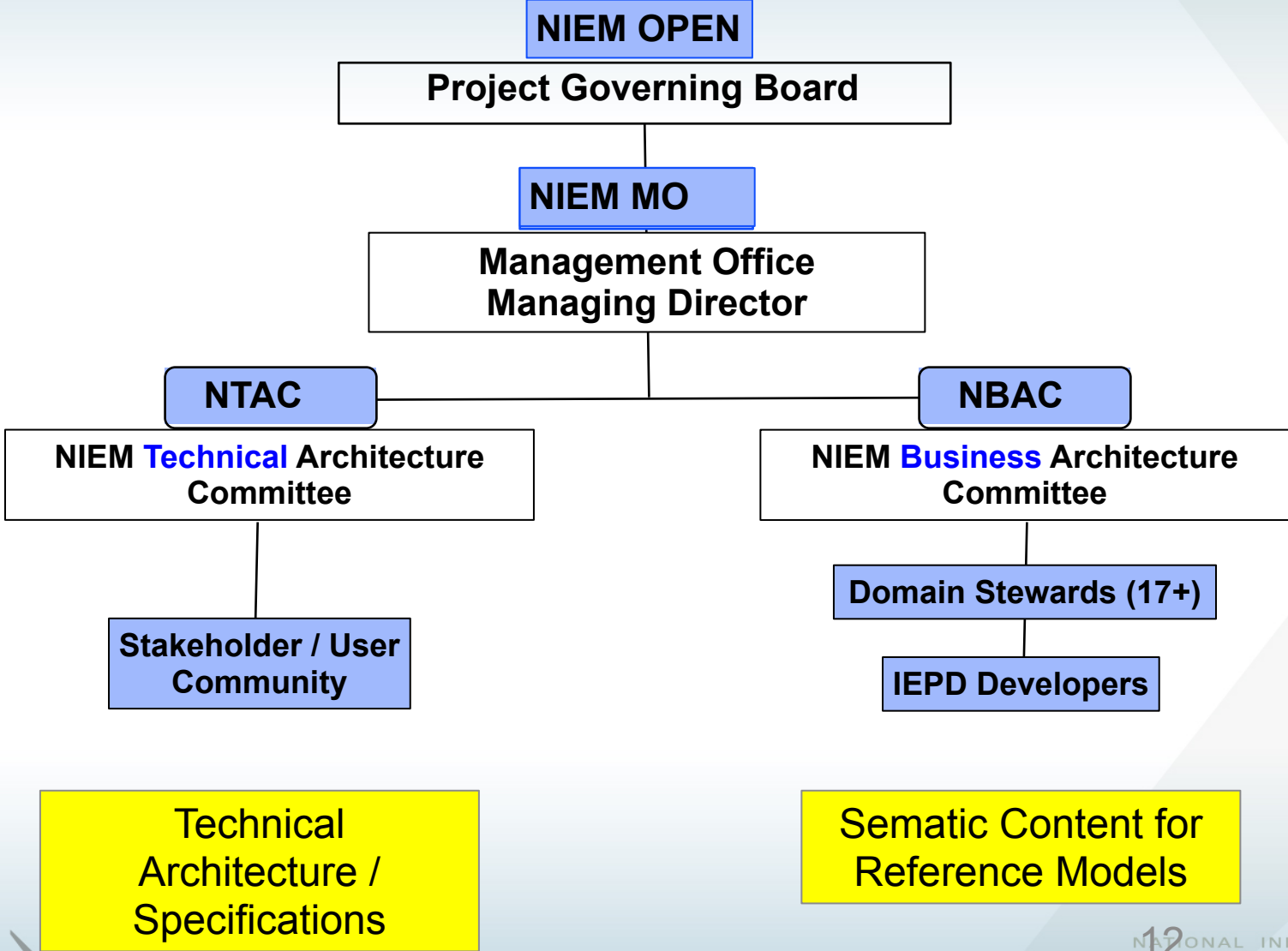

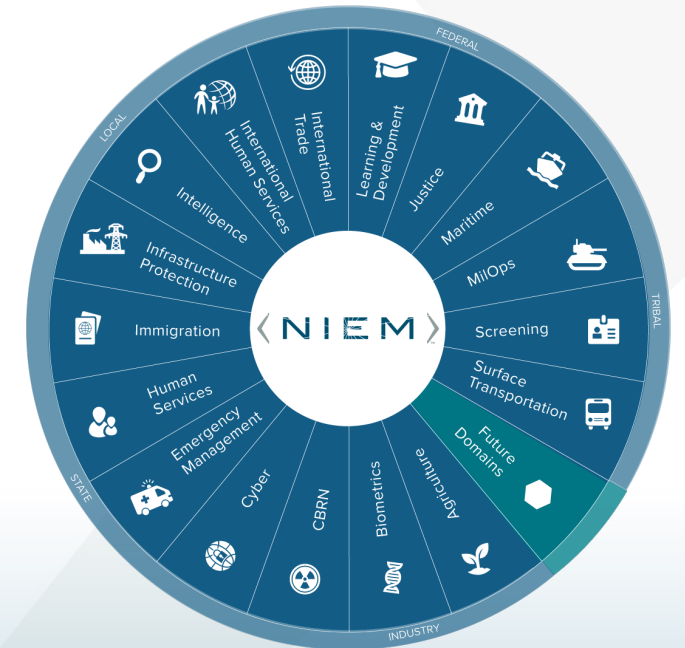

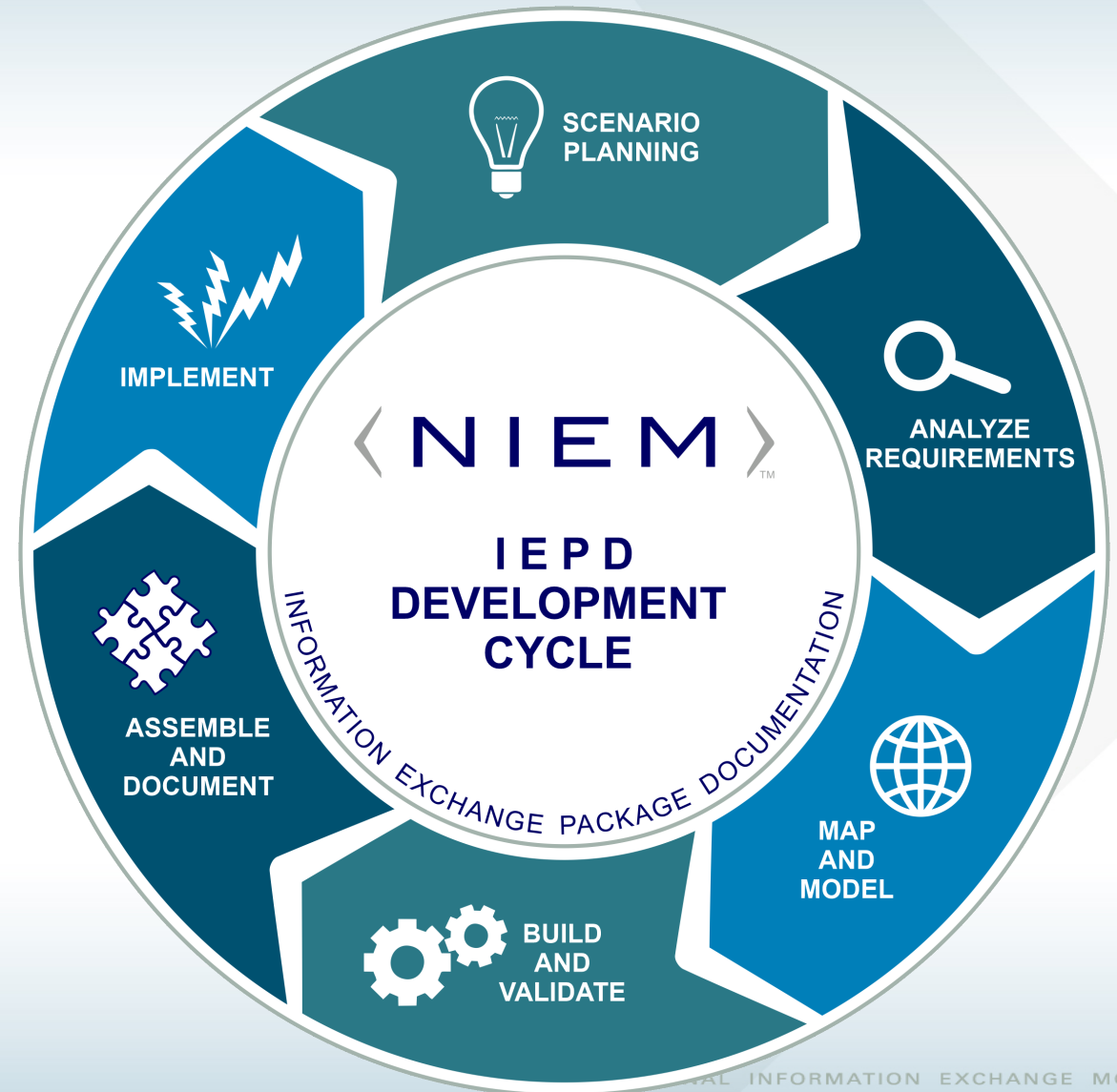

Collaboration
